Comrade Biedrzycki served in the U. S. Army from 1967-1970. He served in Korea as a Pay Distribution Specialist with the 7th Infantry Division. His decorations include the National Defense Service Ribbon, Good Conduct Medal, Armed Forces Expeditionary Medal and Korean Defense Medal.

Review state incorporation paperwork for your Post. You should get a card from the Secretary of
State that must be signed and filled out and returned no later than 60 days from the date on the card. (If
you have not paid the \$10.00 fee in the past year, please contact the State Adjutant and he will assist you
in getting a new Articles of Incorporation.)
☐ Scout of the year entries due to the Department HQ by April 1.
Post and District Audit Reports for December are due to Department HQ.
Department Midwinter Conference in January. Those attending should already have their
reservations. (Again, you must order your banquet tickets by Friday, January 10 through headquarters.)
Posts need monthly Community Activity Reports sent to Department HQ.
□ Post membership should be at 95% by Mid-Winter Conference.
District & Posts are encouraged to interact with the Chamber of Commerce in their communities.

- **5. Attention of Post Commanders:** Is directed to the Commander-in-Chief's decision in response to questions raised concerning alcoholic beverages in the Post meeting room during the Post meeting as set forth below: It is held to be objectionable and contrary to accepted rules of order and proper decorum implicit in the ritual of the Veterans of Foreign Wars to permit alcoholic beverages in the Post meeting room during the Post meeting. Accordingly, the presence, dispensation, and/or consumption of alcoholic beverages in VFW meeting rooms during VFW meetings is unacceptable and is prohibited. Any such practice known to exist shall be terminated. It is the intent of the Commander-in-Chief's decision, regarding this response, to include Post, County Council, District and Department meetings, whereas it is held to be objectionable. Please refer to Section 1001 (24.) of the National Manual of Procedure.
- **6. VFW Promotes National Grounding Job Shadow Day:** Over one million students across America will experience first-hand how academic skills they learn in the classroom are put into action in the workplace by shadowing a workplace mentor in a normal day on the job. The first Groundhog Job Shadow day was spearheaded by a coalition that included America's Promise Alliance, Junior Achievement, the Association for Career and Technical Education, the Society for Human Resource Management, the US Department of Education and the US Department of Labor. This program is modeled after the Groundhog Job Shadow Days conducted by the Boston Private Industry Council in 1996 and Bell South in 1997. Post members should inform their employers about this program and have them contact their local high school, United Way or Junior Achievement to participate. - **7. Post Commanders 2014 National By-Laws/Manual of Procedures Podium Edition:** All officers should obtain current 2014 copies of the podium edition of the National By-Laws, Manual of Procedure and Ritual. The 2014 revised edition reflects the amendments adopted by the 114th National Convention, which became effective on August 23, 2013.
- 8. VFW Special Project Program: This program was put in place to recognize VFW units for creating and completing unique and extraordinary community service projects. Record book entry nominations that are found to be complete and well-substantiated should be endorsed by the Department Adjutant or VFW Department Community Activities Chairman and forwarded to National Programs Department. 3 Deadline for entries is April 30 of each year. Every Post Special Project receiving the Award of Excellence in the May judging will be entered in the Fred C. Hall Memorial Outstanding Post Special Project Competition.
